"Unlike in music, there are no child prodigies in painting. What people regard as premature genius is the genius of childhood. It gradually disappears as they get older. It is possible for such a child to become a real painter one day, perhaps even a great painter. But he would have to start right from the beginning. So far as I am concerned, I did not have that genius. My first drawings could never have been shown at an exhibition of children's drawings. I lacked the clumsiness of a child, his naivety. I made academic drawings at the age of seven, the minute precision of which frightened me."




Etapa azul 1901 – 03 Barcelona 1º estilo original

En 1904 Picasso se establece en París donde conoce a la modelo Fernande Olivier quien será su amante por los próximos 7 años. Picasso le propone matrimonio y ella lo rechaza negando que es mujer casada.

Ellas visitan frecuentemente en circo, fue allí donde consiguió la inspiración para los protagonistas de su período rosa.

Acrobat on a ball



París 1905. Picasso adquiere su palpa, usando naranja, rojo, amarillo-ocre y gris. Sus harlequines, acróbatas, y otros artistas del circo se hacen más estilizados, delicados y expresivos. La galería parisina de Ambroise Vollard compra la mayoría de los cuadros "rosa". Esto marcó el comienzo de la prosperidad para Picasso: más nunca tendría que preocuparse por el dinero.







"Guernica, the oldest town of the Basque provinces and the center of their cultural traditions, was almost completely destroyed by the rebels in an air attack yesterday afternoon. The bombing of the undefended town far behind the front line took exactly three quarters of an hour. During this time and without interruption a group of German aircraft - Junker and Heinkel bombers as well as Heinkel fighters - dropped bombs weighing up to 500 kilograms on the town. At the same time low-flying fighter planes fired machine-guns at the inhabitants who had taken refuge in the fields. The whole of Guernica was in flames in a very short time."








Guernica 1937

A Gestapo officer once brandished a reproduction of his painting Guernica and asked Picasso: "Did you do this?" And Picasso answered: "No, you did this."



"The different styles I have been using in my art must not be seen as an evolution, or as steps towards an unknown ideal of painting. Everything I have ever made was made for the present and with the hope that it would always remain in the present. I have never had time for the idea of searching. Whenever I wanted to express something, I did so without thinking of the past or the future. I have never made radically different experiments. Whenever I wanted to say something, I said it the way I believed I should. Different themes inevitably require different methods of expression. This does not imply either evolution or progress; it is a matter of following the idea one wants to express and the way in which one wants to express it."

Amante 1953-1961. 2do esposa 1961
1973 pintó más de 70 cuadros de ella
en un año. Ella no permitió que los
hijos Claude y Paloma asistieran al
funeral de su padre.
Jacqueline se suicidó en 1986.



Genevieve Laporte
Amante 1951-1953, dejó a Picasso el mismo año que Francoise.
Once años después escribió un libro acerca de su aventura con
Picasso.
